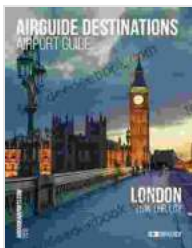

## Heathrow Airport (LHR)

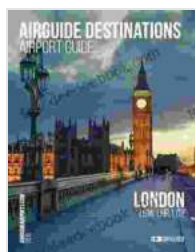

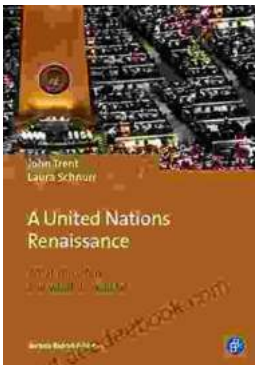
