1. Cast on 96 stitches.

2. Knit in stockinette stitch (knit every row) for 5 inches.
3. Begin decreasing by knitting two stitches together at the beginning and end of each row.
4. Continue decreasing until you have 12 stitches remaining.
5. Cut the yarn and pull it through the remaining stitches to close the hat.
6. Weave in the ends and enjoy your new hat!

A yarn cake scarf is another easy project that's perfect for beginners. You can use any type of yarn cake, but a bulky yarn will give you a scarf that's warm and cozy.

Materials:

- 1 yarn cake (approx. 200g)
- Size 10 (6mm) knitting needles
- Tapestry needle

Instructions:

1. Cast on 40 stitches.
2. Knit in stockinette stitch (knit every row) for 60 inches.
3. Bind off all stitches.
4. Weave in the ends and enjoy your new scarf!

A yarn cake blanket is a larger project, but it's still easy enough for beginners. You can use any type of yarn cake, but a worsted weight yarn

will give you a blanket that's both warm and lightweight.

Materials:

- 4 yarn cakes (approx. 400g each)
- Size 11 (8mm) knitting needles
- Tapestry needle

Instructions:

1. Cast on 120 stitches.
2. Knit in garter stitch (knit every row) for 60 rows.
3. Bind off all stitches.
4. Weave in the ends and enjoy your new blanket!

Yarn cake toys are a great way to use up leftover yarn and make something fun for kids. You can find free patterns for yarn cake toys online, or you can create your own.

Materials:

- 1 yarn cake (approx. 100g)
- Size 6 (4mm) knitting needles
- Fiberfill
- Tapestry needle

Instructions:

1. Cast on 24 stitches.
2. Knit in stockinette stitch (knit every row) for 12 rows.
3. Bind off all stitches.
4. Sew the two short ends of the rectangle together to form a tube.
5. Stuff the tube with fiberfill.
6. Sew the open end of the tube closed.
7. Embroider on eyes, a nose, and a mouth.
8. Enjoy your new toy!

Yarn cake coasters are a quick and easy way to add a pop of color to your home décor. You can use any type of yarn cake, but a cotton yarn will give you coasters that are both absorbent and durable.

Materials:

- 1 yarn cake (approx. 50g)
- Size 8 (5

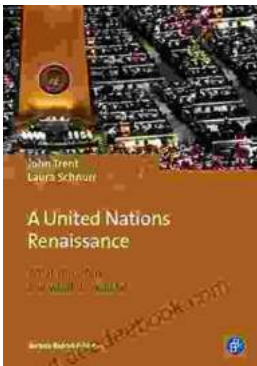
