Before your surgery, you will meet with your anesthesiologist. The anesthesiologist is a doctor who specializes in giving anesthesia. The anesthesiologist will ask you about your medical history and any medications you are taking. They will also perform a physical examination

and order some tests to make sure that you are healthy enough to have surgery.

On the day of your surgery, you will need to arrive at the hospital several hours early. You will be given a gown to wear and will be asked to remove any jewelry or other objects that could interfere with the surgery. You will also be given a sedative to help you relax. The anesthesiologist will then start the anesthesia.

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
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
