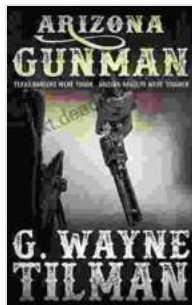


Wayne Tilman: The Notorious Arizona Gunman Who Terrorized the Southwest

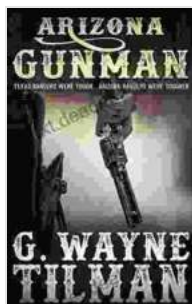

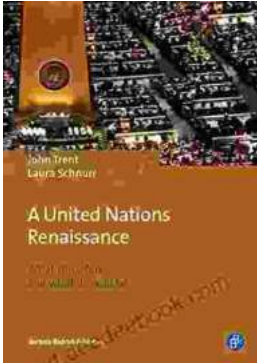
